

OTA A KAMILA STUTZOVI A JEJICH SYN JIŘÍ



Ota se narodil Julii a Aloisovi Stutzovým 18. srpna 1871 v malé vesnici Zahrádka nedaleko Úněšova. Měl osm sourozenců. Na začátku nového století se seznámil s Kamilou, dcerou Jindřicha a Marie Steinových ze Strakonice. Vzali se v roce 1904 ve Strakonici. Žili dlouho v Teplicích, kde se jim narodily děti, Ota byl obchodník a Kamila se starala o rodinu. První přišel na svět v roce 1905 syn Jan Erich a v roce 1913 se narodila dvojčata Jindřich a Jiří. Informace o dceři Gertrudě se nám nepovedlo zjistit. Jan, Jindřich a pravděpodobně i Gertruda odešli na podzim 1938 po záboru Sudet do Velké Británie, kde dosud žijí jejich potomci. Ota, Kamila a syn Jiří se na začátku války ocitli v Plzni, bydleli v Plachého ulici 3.

26. ledna 1942 odjeli transportem T do terezínského ghetta. Hned v květnu téhož roku byl Jiří deportován do Lublinu a zavražděn v Majdanku. Kamila a Oto zůstali v Terezíně do podzimu, 19. října byli deportováni do Treblinky a tam zavražděni.

OTA AND KAMILA STUTZ AND THEIR SON JIRI

Ota was born to Julie and Alois Stutz on August 18, 1871, in the small village of Zahrádka near Úněšov. He had eight siblings. At the beginning of the new century, he met Kamila, the daughter of Jindřich and Marie Stein from Strakonice. They married in 1904 in Strakonice. They lived for a long time in Teplice, where their children were born; Ota was a merchant and Kamila took care of the family. Their first child, Jan Erich, was born in 1905, and in 1913, twins Jindřich and Jiří were born. We were unable to find any detailed information about their daughter Gertrude.

Jan, Jindřich, and probably Gertrude left for Great Britain in the autumn of 1938 after the occupation of the Sudetenland. Their descendants still live there today. At the beginning of the war, Ota, Kamila, and their son Jiří were living in Plzeň, at 3 Plachého Street.

On January 26, 1942, they were deported on transport T to the Terezín ghetto. In May of the same year, Jiří was deported to Lublin and murdered in Majdanek. Kamila and Ota remained in Terezín until the autumn; on October 19, they were deported to Treblinka and murdered there.
